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A. Resolution 2015-53 - Pension Package

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For the local employer portion of the MERS pension contributions, the unfunded actuarial accrued liability (UAAL) as of the June 30, 2014 valuation will be re-amortized 4 additional years to 25. Consistent with the newly enact RIGL 45-21-43.1, for MERS employers only, the determination of the employer contribution rate, commencing with fiscal year 2017, includes a re- amortization of the current UAAL as of June 20, 2014 over a twenty-five year period and provides for a one-time election to be made by August 1, 2015 to remain under the current 21 year amortization schedule.

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In order to effectuate the election to remain under the current 21-year amortization schedule, we will require a resolution, for each employer group for whom you have control, of your governing body (e.g., City of Town Council, school committee, board, wardens, etc.). If no response is received by August 1st, we will deem the employer group to have accepted the 25-year re-amortization.

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The applicable employer cost related to the enact legislative change and your re-amortization decision is reflected in the attached review FY 2017 contribution rate; your FY 2016 rates however, will remain the same with no changes.

D. Resolution 2015-55 Abatement Authority.

As a temporary measure allow the Cumberland Fire District to abate taxes and/or interest cost to the amount of \$50.00. From time to time, the Town will change the appraised value of the property and rather than rebill the property owner, an abatement process can be completed.

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From time to time a small portion of interest could be waved in the event of a closing on a sale of a property. This is needed to allow the closing to go forward.

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The Cumberland Finance Department would have the authority to abate taxes or interest owed up to \$50.00. This authority would end January 30, 2016. The Cumberland Finance Department would provide a monthly report on any abatements processed. The Cumberland Finance Department would also come to the Fire Committee for approvals for abatement over the \$50.00 limit. The Cumberland Finance Department would also return an Abatement procedure and policy by the January 2016 meeting.

Re: Finance Department Report for Month Ending 10/31/15.

The purpose of this set of reports is to provide an unaudited partial year summary of the financial status of the Cumberland Fire Department for the four-month period of July 1 to October 31, 2015. Attached are the following listed October year-to-date General Fund financial reports for Fiscal Year 2016:

1. Budget vs. Actual Report - Revenues and Expenditures

- 2. Trial Balance Listing General Fund
- 3. Balance Sheet General Fund
- 4. Month of October Profit & Loss Statement
- 5. Commissioner's Report Listing of all checks dated and issued in October

The Budget vs. Actual report includes a year to date percentage value for individual revenue and expenditure accounts which have an adopted budget value as listed. Material factors including year-end projected favorable and unfavorable budget variances are explained in regard to four accounts.

Tax Revenues – Current Year – Acct. 4000: During October \$216,369 was collected. As of October 31, 86%, or \$6,112,774, of our July, 2015 tax levy has been collected. Collection efforts are now being administered based on the adjusted payment due date of October 1 and all accounts with unpaid 2015 taxes are formally in a delinquent status. Substantial planning with Attorney Michelle Baker in regard to our annual tax sale scope and timetable has occurred. Activity including initial taxpayer notification will start in January.

As you are aware, the remaining 14%, or \$990,237, of uncollected 2015 taxes as of October 31 represents budgeted revenue in our FY'16 adopted budget. This 14% value, which I feel is slightly higher than it should be, does merit our close monitoring and monthly reporting.

Revenue – Past Due Amounts – Acct. 4005: Please note that the District administrative staff, led by Business Manager Diane Karolyshyn, effectively maintains a balance between consistent and aggressive collection efforts and by providing fair and uniform treatment to all delinquent taxpayers based upon preestablished policies and procedures. Taxpayers are receiving fair, friendly and consistent customer service and simultaneously from July to October, the District has collected \$46,760 in past due tax amounts. This

amount represents 18% f budget. From January to June, during the tax sale process and afterwards, the remainder of this budgeted amount of \$260,000, or more, will be collected.

Hydrant Fees – Cumb/Pawt – Acct. 5238: Finance has planned to propose a transfer resolution to resolve this over-expenditure, in January after the audit is final.

Recent discussions with our auditors may provide an alternate solution which would result in transferring the cost or part of this cost to the prior year. The valuable benefit in this period cost shift would be to support the important "Year 1" outcome of the current 2016 fiscal year end performance by reducing costs. With regard to our income statement, \$304,000 offers a significant layer of confidence to insure that we sustain a favorable surplus performance in this critical first year of financial activity. In contrast, this same amount would not materially change our financial position as reported on our June 30, 2016 balance sheet.

This decision needs to be made in the next few days and I will consult with and advise Chairman Lemois after I discuss this matter further with our audit manager tomorrow (12/4). Cumberland Water and Pawtucket Water invoice dates including listed service periods strongly suggest that a significant portion of \$303,695 hydrant cost recorded as an expenditure in the current 2016 year has a more appropriate relationship with the prior 2015 year.

If this is the case, I would most likely recommend incurring the cost in the prior 2015 year and emphasize that this shift is very beneficial and appropriate because it occurs in our first critical year of operations as a new accounting entity. For a second or subsequent year of operations, our specific prior practices of realizing expenses or other transaction types, are generally required to be the same for all years in order to produce single and comparative period financial statements that are based on reliably uniform and generally accepted accounting standards.

Salaries – Firefighters – Acct. 5340.01: This \$2.9 million account is our largest expense and needs periodic review and comment. For the first four months of the fiscal year, this account, which tends to have a constant rate of expenditure, is performing on target and equal to budget. As of October 31 and at the four-month point, 33% or \$949,256 has been expended.

Collateralized Funds:

The District utilizes Navigant Credit Union for most banking activity. Their nearby branch location, their array and quality of services, on line banking and our favorable vendor history with our past districts are all advantages that currently meet our needs.

However, in order to comply with particular cash management requirements, I approached Navigant and firmly requested an essential service we never had in the past. Recently, at no cost to the District, we were able to increase the guaranteed security of all of our deposit amounts at Navigant based on a 'Collateralized Funds Agreement'.

(Collateralized Funds, continued)

As you are likely aware, individual depositors at banks are subject to the rules of the FDIC and individual depositors at credit unions are subject to the rules of the NCUA and are only insured to a maximum amount of \$250,000.

Navigant Officer Daniel O'Brien recently placed, per agreement, the Cumberland Fire Department into their group of clients who receive the protection of collateralized deposits. Such deposits are backed, as determined by Navigant, by U.S. Treasuries acquired on daily basis form the Boston office of the Federal Reserve Bank. Our maximum amount of protection is currently \$5 million. This amount can be increased on an immediate basis, if needed.

Banking/financial systems collapse, natural disasters, war, economic markets/system collapse, or individual bank failure are some of the reasons why this collateralized funds capability would potentially need to be executed. It's a layer of security and may be a critical part of supporting the continuity of our operations at a time of crisis.

Please note that for the October and November reports that certain balance sheet accounts are pending injection of accurate values subsequent to the full approval of audited values dated July 1, 2015.
